BACKGROUND

The Rotary Club of Grove City brings together business and professional leaders to provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards and to help build goodwill. A key focus area to accomplish these goals is interacting with and engaging northwest Pennsylvania youth in meaningful ways to help develop tomorrow's leaders.

The Rotary Club of Grove City has partnered with Grove City College to host a one-day event focused on promoting thoughtful dialogue about what defines ethical behavior and choices. Based on Rotary's Four-Way Test, the symposium's curriculum is presented in engaging, diverse and interactive formats, including play presentation, small classroom discussions and a unique "open mic" session. Students are encouraged to think about ethics in a more holistic approach, and how the choices they make impact their lives, their family and friends, and their community.

Students learn about ethical theories and concepts; explore why it is important to behave ethically; develop ethical decision-making skills for application in their daily lives.

PARTICIPATION

Participation in the 2016 symposium is currently open to 27 local high school (10-junior year students from each). Students are selected by the school for their leadership skills, academic abilities and commitment to service. We encourage a broad range of students to participate. All student participants must commit to the entire day and will not be dismissed before 2:00 p.m. Teachers will receive Act 48 Credit for attending a Professional Seminar on Ethics during the symposium.
